Presents everyday life in ancient Egypt by portraying members of a wealthy family at home and away.

Berryman, Jerome W. *The Great Family*. Large type edition. New York, NY: Church Publishing, 2014.

Presents Jerome Berryman's story "The Great Family" (from The Complete Guide to Godly Play, Volume 2) in picture book format.

Delval, Marie-Helene. *Psalms for Young Children*. Grand Rapids, MI: Eerdmans Books for Young Readers, 2008.

This collection of Psalms, paraphrased for children, uses simple imagery to help children express their feelings using the words of the Psalms.

Gallery, Philip D. <u>Can You Find Bible Heroes?: Introducing Your Child to the Old Testament</u>. Cincinnati, Ohio: Franciscan Media, 1998.

Children can find objects and people hidden in illustrations depicting Old Testament stories.

An illustrated celebration of the role of Miriam in the Exodus story recounts how she persuaded her parents to defy the pharaoh and give birth to her brother Moses and used her miraculous well to help her people survive.

McDermott, Gerald. <u>Creation.</u> 1st edition. New York: Dutton Juvenile, 2003. McDermott uses poetic language and abstract art to invite contemplation on God's creation.

McKellar, Shona, and Masahiro Kasuya. *Beginning of the Rainbow*. London England: Evans Bros., 1977.

A re-telling of the story of the Ark and the Flood from Genesis, Chapter 9.

Mead, Joy. <u>The Telling Place</u>. Scotland, UK: Wild Goose Publications, 2002. A book of reflections on stories of women in the Bible. Joy Mead imagines the women mentioned in the Bible as central to their own stories, rather than appearing briefly on the margins of a narrative which reflects a world perceived and led by men.

Petras, Ross, and Kathryn Petras. <u>Fandex Family Field Guides: Old Testament: Stories from the Bible</u>. New York: Workman Publishing Company, 2001.

Introduces important figures from the Old Testament. Each entry is illustrated with a selection of images from paintings, sculpture, and illuminations, and includes notes on names and lineage.

Poole, Susie. <u>A Time for Everything.</u> Reprint edition. B&H Kids, 2017. An illustrated children's version of Ecclesiastes 3.

Publishing, DK *Discoveries:* <u>Tutankhamun: The Life and Death of A Pharaoh</u>. New York: DK CHILDREN, 1998.

Relates the story of the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and what it revealed about the funeral rites of the pharaoh.

Ross, Hammer Lillian, and Kyra Teis. <u>Daughters of Eve: Strong Women of the Bible</u>. English Language edition. New York: Barefoot Books, 2000.

Inspirational stories Jewish women of the Bible who stood up for their beliefs and emerged triumphant--including Ruth, Abigail, Miriam, Zipporah, and Esther--dramatize their lives and daily struggles.

Sasso, Rabbi Sandy Eisenberg. <u>But God Remembered: Stories of Women from Creation to the Promised Land.</u> 1st edition. Woodstock, VT: Jewish Lights, 2008.

A collection of stories that gives voices and names to women from biblical and ancient times whom we seldom remember, Lillith, Serach, Bityah, and the Daughters of Z.

A picture book of the well-known song by Pete Seeger, based on Ecclesiastes 3.

The story of Mary is told through the eyes of a wise, old woman sitting under a shady tree, with neighborhood children gathered around. It turns out that the woman is Mary herself, recounting her life with Jesus.

Wildsmith, Brian. *Jesus*. First Edition. Grand Rapids, Mich: Wm. B. Eerdmans Publishing Co., 2000.

Wildsmith shares the life of Jesus of Nazareth in a series of illustrations, framed by gold.

This classic children's book is a story of life, death and resurrection. Sylvester the donkey finds a magic pebble that fulfills his wishes until everything goes horribly wrong and he becomes a rock. It takes an act of love and hope to bring him back to life.

A large (11""x17"") format book, good for sharing the story of Holy Week and Easter with large groups.
